A message from a mentor, Phyllis Serfaty

It was my daughter, an English teacher in Israel, who brought this wonderful program to my attention. She had heard about it through a friend, and while her school did not participate, she was very excited by the idea. She felt it would be a good fit for me. I am a biologist by training and spent many years



researching and teaching at the university level. During the last ten years of my career, I was a research teacher in a High School. I instructed students on how to conduct research in the STEM fields, a complicated and precise undertaking. My student is a delightful and devoted student.

I have found her company very interesting. Her grandfather was from Morocco, just like my husband's family. We share some similar customs and commonality which we discussed. She is so animated and interested in hearing and learning new things. Although, at times it can be frustrating learning a new language. I can completely relate to her frustration. During the pandemic I signed up for Hebrew classes, to brush up on my language skills. It can be difficult to express the ideas in your head properly in another language. The biggest struggle is to find someone who is willing to speak with you, I know from my experience that this practice is worth gold.

Something struck me while speaking to a student this year. School had just reopened after a long closure and we were trying to re-arrange their session to meet their new schedule. The student was being very non-committal and felt very guilty about it. "You have to understand", they told me, "It's not that I don't want to, it's just that this is the only consistent thing about my schooling



this year. I am going back to school, but I do not know my schedule, I do not know if all my teachers are going back, there is just so much uncertainty."

This really hit home, prior to founding the Israel Connect program, I spent 7 years in the classroom as a teacher. If there is one thing we know for certain about students and education it is that students thrive on consistency. It was very scary to think that students missed out on such an important factor at such a crucial time in their lives. Our students are in their final years of primary education and are starting to make the transition to the second part of their lives. At the same time, I feel so privileged to be able to be part of the "one consistent thing". To be able to provide some consistency despite everything else that is going on. To be part of an incredible team of hundreds of individuals who have added a little balance during a difficult time. Sometimes all it takes one small anchor to help you weather a storm. Thank you to our entire family of mentors who were there for our students day in and day out. A special thanks to our incredible staff who managed to pivot on a dime, and despite all the changes, managed to service hundreds of mentors and students with a smile.



A message from a student, Na'ama Biton

I have always wanted to improve my English. I know that in order to fulfil my dreams and pursue any kind of post-secondary study, I will have to feel comfortable with this important international language. When I heard about the Israel Connect program, I felt it was right for me. There is no better way than to speak with someone for whom it is their mother tongue.

Although at first, I had my doubts. Would I be able to have the confidence to open my mouth? Will I

be able to have a conversation with an unfamiliar mentor? I have never really spoken English, maybe just a few minutes during class time. I started the program full of concerns, but I was really surprised. My mentor, Phyllis, is charming with a wonderful personality. She is patient with me, encouraging is honest and caring. I speak fluently and have confidence in speaking English.

I am so proud of my decision to join this program. I feel it has really accelerated my English development. I even surprise myself sometimes.
