

From one of our mentors, Debbie Rozenberg

Having retired after a fulfilling 28-year teaching career, I was not ready to let go of my passion for education. Little did I know that this program would not only benefit the students I worked with but also provide me with a profoundly positive experience.

Creating a Safe Space for Growth:

By engaging with these students, I hoped to enhance their vocabulary, improve their pronunciation, and most importantly, boost their confidence to speak English. It has been heartening to witness the transformation of these students, as they gradually shed their inhibitions and become more at ease with speaking English. I realized that even if they didn't possess extensive knowledge of the language, confidence played a crucial role in their progress. Encouraged by their willingness to practice and try, I focused on alleviating their fear of making mistakes. Emphasizing the low-stakes nature of our interactions, I assured them that their reading and speaking abilities were not being graded. This freedom allowed them to take risks and learn without the fear of judgment.

Nurturing a Supportive Environment:

Building their vocabulary was a priority, but it required patience and perseverance to make the students feel comfortable enough to make mistakes and ask for help. I pushed myself to ensure they comprehended the new words and concepts introduced during our sessions. Over time, their openness to feedback and eagerness to learn became apparent. This one-on-one engagement proved to be immensely valuable, particularly for those who were nervous or shy. Being able to contribute my knowledge and skills, even in retirement, gave me a sense of purpose and fulfillment.

Participating in the Israel Connect program has been an incredibly rewarding experience. By helping these students develop their language skills, gain confidence, and embrace the joy of learning, I have witnessed firsthand the positive impact of this initiative. Even in retirement, I find immense satisfaction in being able to make a difference and remain useful to others.
